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COUNCILWOMAN CRUZ: Mayor Bianchi, fellow

Council Members, honored guests, family, friends and constituents, on behalf of all of us who have had the privilege to be candidates, I want to begin by thanking the party for the conduct of this election.

Keeping positive is what we strive to do and I think that is what we were successful in.

I'd like to thank my family for their constant support during the campaign. Without you giving me your complete love and believing in me, I would not be able to do this.

A constant message from so many people is that they have become tired of politics. They don't see how it changes things. They have also lost faith in politicians. This should be an alarm to all parties. So in the term to come, I hope that we can engage the community to become involved so that we don't continue to turn people away from politics. I want us to be seen, visible, active and in touch, in every corner of North Arlington. That way we can strengthen the ties within the community.

One of my goals is to reconnect with the people who feel that politics -- political parties offer no solution to the problems, to improve the public services on which everyone in North Arlington depends, to be available to listen to the concerns

and the problems and also to the suggestions on where
we can improve. To achieve these things we must be
prepared to work with others.

To quote John F. Kennedy, "Let us not seek the Republican or Democrat answer, but the right answer. Let us not seek to fix the blame for the past. Let us accept our own responsibility for the future." We all started the campaign with a label, as Republican or Democrat. That has to stop now. The only way to move forward and to change things for the positive is to act as one united governing body.

Thank you for electing me to this Council for this term. I look forward to serving the people of the Borough of North Arlington.

COUNCILMAN PRONTI: I'm not going to be as long-winded as Kerry. Tonight begins the future of North Arlington. Thank you all for coming and for supporting Mayor Bianchi, myself and the rest of the Council.

I want to acknowledge our honored guests, Freeholder Tanelli, our past Council Members, and I just saw Lyndhurst Mayor Giangeruso walk in, all of

our Borough employees, our volunteer fire department, our EMS, our DPW and our police department.

Police nationwide have been dragged through the mud and their actions have been criticized over the past few years, but more so this past year, mostly by those who do not understand the job or by those who are taught to disrespect it.

Here in North Arlington we support our police and we expect support in return. We encourage our residents to do the same and to respect their authority. If this practice is adhered to, the legal system will be able to function as it was intended. Our first responders are an essential part of our community and I am proud to have served myself. Tonight I thank you all for what you do.

All right, I want to begin tonight by acknowledging by biggest support, my wife Tammy, as well as my daughter, my parents, my dearest friends, my neighbors, my fellow coaches who came here tonight to show their support and faith in me. I want to congratulate my running mates and extend a very big thank you to all of our supporting cast during our election; Jimmy Bocchino, Lenny Kaiser, Gary Burns, Rich Hughes, Lenny Aluotto, Brian Fitzhenry. I see most of you are here. So thank you.

I also wanted to thank Barbara Kaiser who took the time to plan tonight's reception that's outside afterwards.

We ran a long, hard-fought campaign and the people of North Arlington rallied behind us. The election members -- the election numbers, I'm sorry, clearly showed that we have a tremendous following. Now comes the difficult part. We can't let the people of North Arlington down. We have to roll up our sleeves and we have to get to work.

I'm very much looking forward to the next three years and beyond when I will have an opportunity to work with most of the diligent people that you see here before you on the Council. We will also need the cooperation of our residents.

Remember, we are a team and together we do great things.

There are quite a few programs that I would like to see implemented in North Arlington.

There are also quite a few areas where I can see an opportunity to save taxpayers money while not neglecting the services that they receive. This is the tricky part of running a town. We have begun assembling a team of skilled professionals who we believe can carry out these tasks. If there are

areas where it doesn't work, we will have to fix it.

This will not be an overnight transformation and it's going to take a little time. So we ask that you are all patient but remain diligent in holding us to our obligation.

We plan to address new development over the next few years. This is something that's been talked about for a long time, but we still haven't seen many results. Secondly, I want to thank my wife and my family for supporting me over the last eight years. It's been a tough one. My wife was there behind me a hundred

Our Republican party, I want to thank them also. They were behind us. Their names were just mentioned a few minutes ago. But there's one person in particular that I want to thank, a very close friend of mine, Jimmy Bocchino. When my legs gave out walking up these hills, Jimmy did it for me. When signs fell down on rainy nights, Jimmy went and fixed them. Whatever I asked him to do for me he did. And I just want to thank my buddy Jimmy. I don't know where he is. Where are you, Jimmy? He ran; he left. He's so small you can't see him. Okay.

Ladies and gentlemen, on behalf of the governing body, I would like to welcome you all this evening. Today is the start of a new year and a new administration. I would like to thank all of you for coming tonight, especially those who supported us in this last election. I want to congratulate my running mates, Dan Pronti and Kerry Cruz. We made some hell of a team out there, boy, ringing

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doorbells. We did it for two years, all of '13 to
run for Council last year in November and all of '14.

So I got a little weak at the end and that's when

Jimmy picked up for me.
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I also want to thank Mayor Pete Massa and Mark Zampaglia for your years of service and dedicated service. Mayor Pete Massa was a very dear friend of mind and I hope he still remains a very dear friend of mine.

I would like to express my gratitude and thanks to our employees and our volunteers for their excellent work they have undertaken over this past year, especially under some very difficult circumstances. Our police force of 27 officers who are doing the work of what should be 35 officers. Our volunteer fire department and emergency squad who in my opinion is the best in the country, not just in New Jersey and are second to none in dedicating theirselves to our public, especially at two, three, four o'clock in the morning when you need an emergency squad. They are there and they are professionals. Our DPW that is down to 10 people doing the job that they can do under such difficult circumstances. There's only 10 of them.

Let us not forget our Library and Health

Department staff who provide excellent service for our residents. I got to say a little word off this, off my little speech, and that is I think we have a great -- I think we have a great library. Our library is second to none. They have programs for the kids, for the adults and they're open and it's such a beautiful place. We have a great library, and I just wanted to say that.

I also want to say something off the -off my little speech on our new CERT team that was
enacted. Our CERT team is a bunch of people who got
together and help the police department. They don't
get paid; they're volunteers. They're out in the
rain when there's fires, municipal raids, and they
help the police department with no monetary reward.
I want to thank them for that.

Also too our county park has been redone providing a field, a home field for Queen of Peace, and also for our residents of our town to use. The county did a fantastic job. One of the leaders was Mr. Tanelli who helped a lot. And also to our Recreation volunteers. Our Recreation volunteers who work free of charge, handling all our children, raising our kids really and teaching them the right way, playing softball for the girls, baseball and

football for the kids. So if there's any Rec people here tonight, I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart. Yous did a great job, and yous have always done a great job.

Our community has gone through so much over the past decade, but the last few years have tested our strength. We went through two major hurricanes, Sandy being the worst. And also too not to mention the crippling ice storm that we had on Halloween a few years ago that brought trees down through people's homes and through wires. And also the terrible winter that we went through in '13 and '14 which cost North Arlington hundreds of thousands of dollars. And people scream sometimes about their taxes, but that's basically where a lot of the money went in the last few years.

While we celebrate today, we must realize that we have financial problems that we have been left with. One of the biggest blunders I saw over the past 10 years was selling of our water system without the thought of homeowners' impact on their bills. That's one of the biggest complaints I get when I go from door to door, and I've gone door to door for two years. People weren't so concerned about their taxes, but they were so burnt up about

their water bills. Unfortunately, the rates are going to keep rising as a result of this bad agreement. We fought them, but we lost.

We need to put our heads together and break down the problems and prioritize what we have to do immediately. One-time gimmicks like selling our water system is not the answer.

We have cut our DPW to the point where we can't cut any further. I think there's only 10 guys doing the work in the town. We must be smarter and not play politics, which is difficult but we have to try to do this.

Most importantly, we cannot continue to push financial problems down the road, from budget to budget. It doesn't work. We need to find new ratables in our community, and we can do that by using our redevelopment powers.
